Encouragement for voluntary action by each individual to provide more than a minimum for himself, his family and his local community.

Red Cross could play a role in measures (c, d, and e) listed in the disaster management plan below:

Disaster management" means a continuous and integrated multi-sectoral, multi-disciplinary process of planning and implementation of measures aimed at:

- (c) Emergency preparedness;
- (d) a rapid an effective response to disasters; and
 - (e) Post-disaster recovery and rehabilitation
 - Red Cross could invite citizens to do a 2 hour first aid course provided and funded by their facility. Thus each neighbourhood could have citizens prepared in first aid on voluntary duty in the event of a disaster.
 - Provide temporary loans of medical equipment: wheel chairs, mobility aids, blankets.
 - Provide Soup ingredients

Answers to questions listed at Network of Care (NOC) workshop. What are your skills and experience?

First aid training, equipment and teaching resources in a class room. Previous organisational experience in large hospitals- including emergency response. Considerable and varied project management

What is the capacity of your resources and volunteer availability? Five Red Cross volunteers could respond to ICS when a disaster management plan is approved and clear lines of accountability are drawn up.

Other considerations/suggestions:

Placing Assembly points/meeting place identified in each neighbourhood Citizens may respond on a WhatsApp group.

Should potential power outage be considered as a disaster?
